

Students are to be reading a "just right" chapter book at home for a minimum of 20-30 minutes a day. To show evidence of comprehension of the text being read, students are required to choose at least 5 activities from the list below. (No

## comic books!) Due Tuesday, September 27<sup>th</sup>.

- 1. Create a diorama to demonstrate your favorite part of the story
- 2. Design a mobile using various , chapters, events and characters from the story
- 3. Make a dictionary of 10 new vocabulary words you learned in the book, write the definitions, guide words, and parts of speech.
- 4. Rewrite the ending of the story and illustrate it. Be able to describe the original ending vs. your new alternative ending.
- 5. Make stick puppets of the characters in the story and put on a puppet show
- 6. Make a 5-7 page picture book illustrating scenes and events from the story that the author helped you to visualize
- 7. Design a poster to advertise your book. Write a paragraph highlighting the best features of your book
- 8. Produce a book jacket that could be used to cover your book. Include a summary and a section about the author.
- 9. Create a collage related to the book
- 10. Draw a cartoon strip showing particular important events from the book
- 11.Write a letter of appreciation to the author telling them why you enjoyed reading the book
- 12.Bring in souvenirs that represent objects from the book. Write a paragraph for each object explaining their importance to the story's plot
- 13. Build a scale model of an object from the book. Describe its relevance to the story
- 14.Write a letter from the point of view from a character in the story to another character in the story.
- 15. Create a timeline of important events
- 16.Your own idea! (Ask Mrs. Aguilar first)
